



Welcome to the Showcase'18 of State Youth Theatre and OKT-Vilnius City Theatre!

The Youth Theatre performs the first showcase of its latest performances with the OKT-Vilnius City Theatre. Both theatres are located next to the very center of Vilnius's old town. The OKT-Vilnius City Theatre has taken one of the leading roles in Lithuanian theatre for the second decade, thanks to the work of its director, Oskaras Korsunovas. Three decades ago, the Youth Theatre in Vilnius was known as a youth theatre of director Eimuntas Nekrosius and was one of the first theatres in Lithuania to sail to international waters. Today, the Youth Theatre is rejuvenating and seeks to become a new venue for contemporary scene art, linking Lithuanian and foreign artists of different generations. Together we created an intense four-day program of the latest theatre performances. It contains works by well-known Lithuanian and foreign theatre masters and promising youngest Lithuanian artists. We hope that for our guests this program will meaningfully present some of the striking tendencies of contemporary Lithuanian theatre.

Kirsten Dehlholm is a Danish director and video artist, best known as the leader of the Hotel Pro Forma group, that creates plays operas, interdisciplinary projects and performances in various parts of the world. Her latest performance "Brothers Lionheart" is the unconventional insenation of the famous Astrid Lindgren book. It is a visual soundtrack, in which the story of the book is told through the illness, death, betrayal, tyranny, brotherly love, fidelity, courage and other experiences of one character, the Lion Genius of Skrautė. They are revealed by sounds, voices and images on different format screens of simple recycled materials. The sound sceneries created by Danish sound designer Kristian Hverring, surrounding the auditorium, are becoming one of the most important accents of the performance. The goal of the creators of the performance is to stimulate the imagination and senses for spectators of different age groups.

THE ŠVEJK

Student of the director Eimuntas Nekrošius directing course at the Lithuanian Academy of Music and Theater, Adomas Juška, debuts with the play "Švejk" based on the novel by Jaroslaw Hašek. In his first work, the young director selects several situations created by the author of the cult novel and through it he seeks to look at Švejk as a person whose smile was not a slight joke but a sharp opposition to government, war and the environment. The surroundings of Švejk in the performance – soldier's shooting range, in which he carry the target as long as the superior soldiers are trained to shoot. Švejk smiles, the chaplain drinks, the soldier screams and shoots ... The director's goal is to reveal something real about the idiotic existence of each of them.

"Trans Trance" is a one act performance about femininity, sexuality, breaking free from stereotypes and the freedom to be who you really are. What is femininity in general? Does being a woman mean having to match a certain generally accepted norm? I feel that the binary perception of the sexes reaffirms stereotypes. We organize talks with women activists, transgender individuals, collect comments and real stories, walk the streets and ask passersby different questions, we write and we talk among ourselves. In this case, the object of the performance is not in the dramaturgy, but in the society", - says young director Kamile Gudmonaite.



The famous Hungarian director Árpád Schilling, has recently been seen as *persona non grata* in his homeland because of the opposition to his government, working in various European countries. Schilling developed a distinctive work method and creates performances without a special literary basis, but deepening in the social, political, and cultural issues of a particular country and conducting a thorough study of the chosen topic. The results of which are developed during rehearsals with the creative team, using actors improvisations and their personal stories. This time, the director turns into an environment that is familiar for him. The topic of autonomy covers a range of issues that are relevant in all post-Soviet, now independent Eastern and Central European countries. In the center of the performance – aspirations of these countries inhabitants to adapt in order to survive in a new social realm, to censor themselves, the fear of speaking, the desire not to become an outsider and inability to cooperate. How do small countries remember their great past? What is their relationship with the current "great empires" and with the idea of a united Europe?

"A Respectable Wedding" by Bertolt Brecht talks about society's moral duplicity. In the play, the plot revolves around the premarital loss of the bride's virginity. In the performance, we look deeper. At not only the hypocritical morality and chastity, but also at the degradation of traditions and the absurdity of sacred part of human existence: weddings, funerals, the sense of the cosmogonic cycle and its celebration. Of course, we also talk about problems specific to Lithuania, such as the confusion of a person who has come to live in the city, their inability to become a so-called bourgeois and, of course, their complete misunderstanding of the globalization processes that affect them in one way or another. Certainly, first it is a wonderful comedy, facing us and our loved ones like a mirror", - says director Oskaras Korsunovas.

After a break of 26 years, legendary director Eimuntas Nekrošius returned to the Youth theater what was theatre of his youth with a performance connecting present time with a time three decades ago. He reflects how the global catastrophes of the end of the 20th century affects us today. Thousands of crippled destinies caused by he Chernobyl nuclear power explosion and Afghanistan's war, thrown to the pheriperies of a new life. Having walked through the tops of the world literature, Nekrošius concentrates on the fate of ordinary people. In Nobel Prize winner Belarusian writer Svetlana Aleksievich's books, used by the director, there are no characters, but true people. Their stories testify feelings and experiences, which are deeper than the reality that can be seen by the naked eye. For many years, Aleksijevich has collected these trials in her books presenting a multifaceted and multivalent truth about the sunset of the "Red Empire". In the center of the performance - personality of Svetlana Aleksievich herself and her journey trough her own time.

"This is a great play to experiment. From the very beginning, it was doomed for explorations. With *The Seagull* we continue exploring the themes also present in *Hamlet* and *The Lower Depths*, those of the contemporary theatre, the contemporary actor, and the contemporary viewer. *The Seagull* is the third part of the triptych. All of these parts are joined together by a special focus on the actors. In *The Seagull* we seem to seek the impression that the audience is included in the story", - says director Oskaras Korsunovas. Treplyov's phrase "We need new forms" and Arkadina's response "That is the talk of a decadent" are more than familiar to Koršunovas' theatre. Its very first performances *There to Be Here, Hello Sonya New Year, P.S. File O.K., Roberto Zucco, Fireface*, as well as the plays that followed, screamed for the need of new forms, while part of the public was categorical and made it clear in one way or another that they thought plays directed by Oskaras Koršunovas were somewhat decadent.



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
